Overview

Interior design is a wonderful profession that is not only glamorous, it is exciting, enlightening, and fulfilling, going by how an interior designer can turn a bunch of empty rooms into **functional, safe and beautiful indoor spaces**

To achieve any successful concept, a designer must start with an idea, which must take into account **function, versatility, safety, and beauty**. The design concept must be a solution, well thought out, and brilliantly put together.

Now is time to wrap up all the information and analysis you did including A1 & A2 to develop your Design Concept.

Objectives

- Get clear about the main concerns for your project & client.
- Investigate a spatial concept using select archetypes (you can use A1 & A2 as an archetypes)
- Explore interior architecture space through thoughtful board/model building

Assignment/Procedure

1. Conceptual writing has three functions:

- I. To state and understand a design problem
- II. To explore and hypothesize a design solution
- III. To present and define a design mission

WRITE A CONCEPT STATEMENT

Articulate the set of main concerns for your project. These would include written statements about the following things:

- The project's essential purpose
- Main goals for the project
- Dominant features and spaces within the program
- Basic programmatic components of the project
- Crucial aspects of the project

2. Create a Board & Physical Model to Explore Spatial Concepts

I. You will have to create a board 30 x 20 where you will express the ideas about your design concept:

- Mood images
- Materials
- Textures
- Color palette
- & any other elements that help you to understand your Design Concept

II. Create a small abstract model (6x6 inches) that speaks about the spatial characteristics [interior architecture] of your project. This model does not need to relate to the building or shell. (abstract model)

- Go to the Intypes website <https://intypes.cornell.edu/intypes.cfm>
- Read about the Intypes and the examples they provide. Look up historic precedents they describe.

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- If you are not satisfied with the taxonomy or archetypes provided at Intypes; go to Ching: For Space and Order or read Rengel, Shaping Interior Spaces chapter 7, 8 and 9 order, enrichment and expression, or use your A1 & A2 for inspiration.
- Document your thinking as you read and explore these sources: drawing and writing.
- Choose one to three strategies that may inform your design ideas and strategies
- Make a model of the intypes [or other interior architectural archetypes you created] and how they might be adapted and developed for your project.
- Consider materials and color palette you will use in your design.

Deliverables

PROJECT CONCEPT STATEMENT

- Well written with almost no typos or grammatical errors
- Identifies important issues and goals.

BOARD/3D CONCEPT MODEL

- Through exploration
- Well-Crafted board/model
- Effective use of materials
- You must be able verbally articulate your exploration and its discoveries.
